Midland Mencap is a local charity which works and campaigns for accessible and inclusive services for better quality of life for everyone with experiences of Learning Disability.

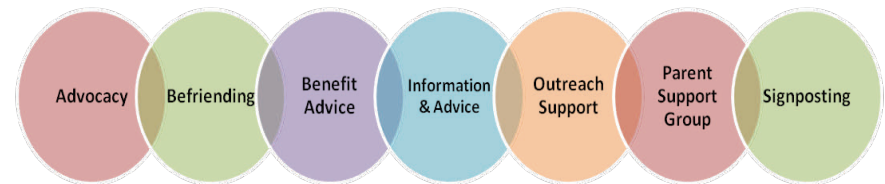
## Service Background
